Bathing regulations at the Lido Unterägeri lido

Dear visitors

Please adhere to the bathing rules during your stay at the Lido, which ensure safety, order and cleanliness in the bathing complex. The bathing rules are binding for everyone present in the facility and must also be observed by schools, clubs and other groups.

Opening and operating hours

The official season of the lido facility lasts from approx. mid-May to mid-September.

Daily bathing with supervision starts at 09.00 hrs and lasts until approx. 19.00 hrs in the early and late season until approx. 20.00 hrs in the high season or during the summer holidays in the canton of Zug, depending on the weather.

In case of bad weather, it is at the discretion of the operations manager, in consultation with the lifeguard, to temporarily suspend supervised bathing operations. In such cases, you can enter the lido without admission and use the sanitary facilities with restricted access.

The red-yellow flag indicates the presence of the lifeguard:

Entry and access regulation

An entrance fee is charged for access to the lido during opening hours. Approximately one hour before the end of bathing supervision, no admission fee is charged. If the lido has to be closed for safety-related, weather-related or organisational reasons, there is no entitlement to a refund of the admission fee. No admission fee is charged for the restaurant visit.

Children under 8 years may only enter and use the facility in the company of a person at least 16 years who bears responsibility. Persons with communicable diseases and open wounds are not allowed to enter the facility. School classes and other groups are to be led into and out of the lido as closed groups by the teachers/supervisors.

Safety rules

Non-swimmers and children under 8 years must always be supervised by a person at least 16 years in the children's pool, non-swimming and swimming areas. Non-swimmers are only allowed in the lake within the non-swimmer area. Outside the non-swimmer area, swimming aids are prohibited for safety reasons. No responsibility is accepted for unsupervised small children and non-swimmers. It is forbidden to swim under the diving area.

Stand Up Paddles (SUP)

Bringing a SUP is allowed, but the following rules must be observed:

- Help prevent the spread of invasive species in our waters.
- Check the board for plant and animal residues before putting it in the water. Clean or rinse your material thoroughly and dry everything carefully.
- Take care when handling the boards, especially when moving around the site.
- Do not disturb other bathers
- Do not store your board in the coveted shaded areas
- It is compulsory to board at the jetty on the far left of the lakeshore!
- Move on the water only outside the swimming area (yellow buoys)

Not allowed

- Bringing animals (with the exception of companion dogs for people with impaired vision)
- Playing music
- Camping
- Lighting fires
- Use of cooking and grilling equipment
- Harassing and endangering bathers
- Photographing or filming people without their permission or for commercial purposes
- Damaging the facilities and plants
- Climbing trees, roofs and the fence.
- Using soap or shower gel in the lake

General

Please dispose of your waste in the numerous bins provided.

All vehicles are to be parked in their designated parking spaces.

Persons under the influence of drugs or alcohol may be expelled from the lido by the manager or lifeguard.

If a bathing guest notices any soiling or damage, he/she must report this immediately.

Courses and events

Permission is required to hold swimming lessons, other courses and events in the lido, as well as the sale or distribution of goods and products. Permits are issued by the community of Unterägeri and the manager.

Authority

Bathers and visitors to the bathing area must obey the instructions of the manager, lifeguard, other staff and the bathing regulations and refrain from doing anything that impairs order, safety and cleanliness. Violations of the bathing rules or the instructions of the staff may be punished with a warning or immediate expulsion from the facility.

In the event of special incidents, the manager may ban access to the lido for a longer period of time after consultation with the community of Unterägeri.

Liability

The municipality of Unterägeri is not liable for:

- a) Damage caused when using the swimming and diving facilities, the playground equipment or other facilities of the pool.
- b) damage caused by third parties (theft, damage to property, injuries during ball games, etc.)
- c) the loss of objects, money or other valuables.

Full compensation must be paid for damage and soiling, whereby legal guardian or their deputies are liable for underage children. Misuse of the rescue equipment and its facilities will result in criminal charges.

Behaviour in emergencies

In the event of an emergency, notify the lifeguard immediately and use the available alarm devices:

Emergency call pillar at each jetty and in the non-swimmer area, red button.

For initial rescue, the net balls or throwing lines clearly visible from the lido can be used as rescue equipment.

Regulation in exceptional cases

The head of operations or his deputy shall be responsible for regulations in exceptional cases.

Wishes

We strive to offer you a well-maintained and clean lido. Please help to keep the effort for cleaning and maintenance of the facility within reasonable limits. Teach your children about our bathing rules.


Complaints
